#### Background and aim of the workshop

The World Heritage Committee approved the extension of the "Primeval Beech Forests of the Carpathians, Slovakia and Ukraine" to include the "Ancient Beech Forests of Germany" at its 35th session (Paris, June 2011). The World Heritage Committee recommended" the States Parties of Ukraine, Slovakia and Germany (...) to ensure a comprehensive approach to conserving the primeval and ancient beech forests of Europe and (...) exploration of the potential for the World Heritage Convention to further these efforts by cooperating with the support of IUCN and the world Heritage Centre, with other interested States Parties towards a finite serial transnational nomination in order to assure the protection of this unique forest ecosystem." (WHC 2011, Decision 35 COM 8B.13.35th).

This workshop is the continuation of two international expert meetings (Oct 2010, Nov 2011) on beech forests as a joint natural heritage of Europe at the International Academy for Nature Conservation Isle of Vilm. The goal of the upcoming expert workshop is: 1. to develop common approaches to select potential component parts for an extension nomination, 2. to define the component parts in the different biogeographical regions, 3. to develop a communication platform and strengthen the beech forest network.

The key selection criterion for the inscription of properties on the World Heritage List is the Outstanding Universal Value (OUV). All additional component parts must clearly add distinct features to the already inscribed serial property. In the further nomination process the focus will be on European biogeographical regions not yet involved, especially on refuge areas and sites presenting an altitudinal gradient that will permit beech forests to adapt to climate change. Potential additional component parts will have to meet criterion (ix) (see para 77 of the Operational Guidelines for the Implementation of the World Heritage Convention), be of high integrity, and add additional values to the existing properties.
